Helpful Information Tips;

Do you know that Aristo-Craft offers replacement track ties? They are available in both the Euro and USA design. The 12" Straight USA ties are Aristo ART-30033 and the Curve USA is Aristo ART 30103. The Curve ties are the 4 foot Diameter, by cutting every other connection on one side only they work perfect for the 5 foot diameter. I did not try to use them on any larger diameter track. This is a lot cheaper than replacing the track and it is easy to replace.
